### **FINDS of the MONTH – John Howell**

We had a fairly good group of entries at the January general meeting, with 4 traditional gold entries (in spite the very wet ground at the Coolgardie claims), a single electronic gold entry and a single treasure display. Prizes will continue to be \$10, \$5 and \$3 gold bags, and points will be awarded toward the Gold Prospector and Treasure Hunter of the Year awards.

In the past, there have been general meetings where there have been no or only one/two entries. Anyone displaying even a tiny bit of gold, or a few coins would have won one the prizes. To further encourage members to display their finds, a drawing has been established for a donated one troy oz American Prospector silver round. Everyone entering a display in the Finds of the Month will have their name placed into the drawing, which will take place at the Xmas party. ## **THE OLD WEST**

Little appreciation is given to our ancestors of the Old West. Pioneers, farmers, ranchers, cowboys, prospectors and settlers, everyone needed to cook and prepare food and each with their own method of preparations and ways of measuring ingredients. A handful of this and a pinch of that.

Today most households have a couple of cook books or a favorite recipe handed down from their mother or grandmother. The modern day cook book and/or recipe as we know it today, is far from those of the Old West.

In the 1800's few cook books were published, nor were they a necessity to the chuckwagon cooks, traveling pioneers, wagon trains across the plains or the occasional hotel with bed and breakfast. Mostly due to the lack of ability to read and write, people were not interested in or would waste their hard earned money on something they'd never use.

However for those who could read, most cook books were of European origin, which created another problem. The European measurements. American Westerners did not understand such measurements and ended up developing their own standards of measuring. A Cup was a Cup, a teaspoon was a teaspoon and a tablespoon was a tablespoon. All of which could be used on the open range. Unlike today's kitchen measurements used, some of the Old West measurements need some interruption by today's standards.

### **ON THE TRAIL MEASUREMENTS**

**Glob.....1 teaspoon (tsp)**

**Bit..... 3/4 teaspoon (tsp)**

**Bitty..... 1/2 teaspoon (tsp)**

**LI'L Bitty..... 1/4 teaspoon (tsp)**

**Lump..... 1 Tablespoon (TBSP)**

**Good Lump.. 2 teaspoons**

**Heap..... Rounded Cupful**

**Whole Heap.. 2 Rounded Cupfuls**

**Bunch..... 6 items**

**Good size piece of lard.... meant about 1/2 cup**

**Then there is the Smidgen, the Pinch and a Dash. A Dash is about 1/8 tsp or less, the smidgen is about 1/2 of a dash and the pinch is somewhere in between smidgen and dash.**

**A Slab of Pork.... which I think is about a pound.**

**Don't let this recipe name scare you this is actually pretty good**

### **Judy's version of Amish Sawdust Pie**

**1 1/4 cups granulated or brown sugar, or half of each**

**1 1/2 cups finely chopped pecans or black walnuts**

**1 1/2 cups graham crackers or vanilla wafer, crushed**

**1 1/2 cups coconut flakes**

**1/2 teaspoon cinnamon, ( I like a little less)**

**1/2 teaspoon nutmeg, ( I like a bit more)**

**7 egg whites, (unbeaten) or use egg beaters instead**

**1 (9 inch) unbaked pie shell**

**Sliced Bananas**

**Heavy Whipping Cream / Cool Whip**

**Combine the first seven ingredients in a large bowl and stir until well blended. Pour into the unbaked pie shell and bake at 375 degrees F, for 35 minutes or until filling is set, do not over bake. Filling is set when you insert a knife and it comes out clean, just like a pumpkin pie.**

**Serve warm or at room temperature. Let cool while you make the whipped cream topping and slice bananas. The original recipe calls for sliced bananas, but I omit the banana slices, but the whip cream is good.**
